

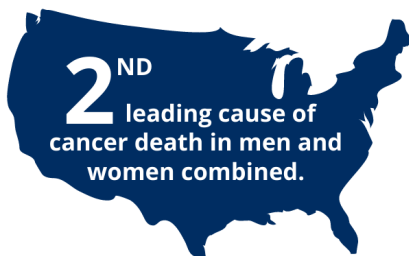
March Is Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

There will be an estimated **149,500 new cases** of colorectal cancer in 2021.

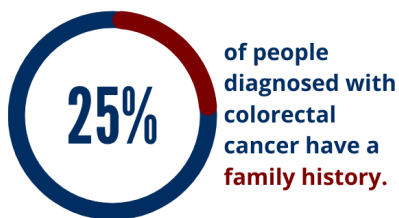
The lifetime risk of developing colorectal cancer is **1 in 23 for men** and **1 in 25 for women**.

Currently, there are **over 1 million colorectal cancer survivors** in the United States.

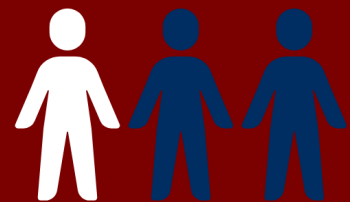

COLONOSCOPY: SCREENING SAVES LIVES

Adults 50 and older should have a colonoscopy every 10 years - or more often if you have a family history of the disease.
